Are you looking for a career change or are you already employed and wanting to upskill? An apprenticeship could be the perfect option!

What is an apprenticeship?

An apprentice is employed and earns a wage while they learn. Apprenticeships combine practical experience and assessment in the workplace with formal off-the-job training at college or in the workplace, to develop their theoretical knowledge.

Apprenticeships are designed by employers and linked to a specific occupation, to ensure you develop the correct skills, knowledge and behaviours that are required to be fully competent in your chosen industry and job role.

Apprenticeships are available to people of all ages and are suitable for those pursuing a new career or looking to upskill in their current role. They are offered at a range of levels from intermediate (level 2) to degree (level 7) and can take one to five years to complete.



Apprentices work for a minimum of 30 hours a week.



You will spend a minimum of 6 hours per week completing 'off-the-job training' which can either be day release in College, remote learning or allocated time in the workplace.



You will earn at least the National Minimum Wage for apprentices.



You will complete a range of assessment activities as part of an 'End-Point Assessment' to evaluate the knowledge, skills and behaviours learnt throughout the apprenticeship.

WHAT IS OFF-THE-JOB TRAINING?

It is a statutory requirement for an apprentice to spend a minimum of 6 hours per week of their paid working hours 'off-the-job'. This time will be spent receiving training to gain the skills needed to complete the apprenticeship.



This training is delivered remotely, in the classroom or in the workplace. Off-the-job-training could include day release at College, completing work, assessor meetings and reviews, coaching from a colleague, and shadowing a colleague. The employer and College will decide on the best model.

How are apprenticeships assessed?

Apprenticeships are assessed through an End-Point Assessment (EPA) which is designed to test your knowledge, skills and behaviours learnt during

the apprenticeship, and to ensure you have achieved full competency within your job role.

If you do not pass the assessment, you will not complete your apprenticeship. EPA assessment could include practical or online exams, synoptic testing, professional discussions, interviews or a portfolio of work, which will be led and graded by the End-Point Assessor.

You will begin preparation for the EPA 3-6 months from the end of your apprenticeship and will be fully supported throughout.

APPRENTICESHIP LEVELS EXPLAINED



There are various levels of apprenticeships dependant on current skills and qualifications. Apprenticeship qualifications are just as substantial as alternative study routes and can still lead to university, upon completion of a level 3 apprenticeship.

See the table below for an explanation of apprenticeship equivalent levels:

Name	Level	Equivalent Educational Level
Intermediate Apprenticeship	2	5 GCSEs (grades 9-4)
Advanced Apprenticeship	3	2 A levels, 4 AS Levels, Level 3 Diploma/ Certificate
Higher Apprenticeship	4, 5, 6 and 7	Foundation, Bachelor's or Master's Degree
Degree Apprenticeship	6 and 7	Bachelor's or Master's Degree

APPLYING FOR AN APPRENTICESHIP

You know what industry you want to work in but have not yet found an employer.

ROUTE 1

Visit our Job Shop to search for live apprenticeship vacancies. To apply for a role, you must register your details with the Find An Apprenticeship website: www.findapprenticeship.service.gov.uk/signin

Once you have submitted an application, you will receive a phone call from us to check you are suitable for the role you have applied for. This may involve a telephone or face-to-face interview.

After your interview with us, you may be shortlisted for an interview with the employer. The employer will decide who gets the apprenticeship, so it is important to sell yourself.

If you are successful, you will be invited to a pre-enrolment session to complete pre-enrolment activities including an English and maths assessment. This is to determine your current working level.

Once your employer has completed their side of the pre-enrolment process, you will then be given a start date for your apprenticeship training.
